

## MOOSEHORN BAPTIST CHURCH

THE MOOSEHORN BAPTIST CHURCH WAS BUILT IN 1914 ON A PARCEL OF LAND WEST OF MOOSEHORN DONATED BY CHRISTOFF NEWMAN. EWALD SEMLAR AND GOTTLIEB KRENTZ WERE MOST RESPONSIBLE FOR ITS CONSTRUCTION.

THE CHURCH WAS AFFILIATED WITH THE NORTH AMERICAN CONFERENCE AND THE CONGREGATION WAS MOSTLY OF GERMAN DESCENT. THIS MADE THE TRANSITION FROM GERMAN TO ENGLISH SERVICES QUITE DIFFICULT LATER ON.

THE CHURCH WAS MOVED TO MOOSEHORN IN 1950 AND A PARSONAGE WAS ADDED IN THE SIXTIES. NINETY SIXTY NINE BROUGHT THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW BUILDING UNDER THE LEADERSHIP OF PASTOR, DAN BUHLER.

TO THIS DAY THE CHURCH CONTINUES TO THRIVE AND IS PROUD TO HAVE NURTURED THE DEVELOPMENT OF A NUMBER OF YOUNG PEOPLE WHO HAVE GONE ONTO FULL TIME AND LAY MINISTRY. AS MUCH AS THE CHURCH PLAYED A CENTRAL ROLE IN THE LIVES OF THE PIONEERS, SO IT IS TODAY WITH ITS PRESENT CONGREGATION. IT WAS AND ALWAYS WILL BE A SOURCE OF COMFORT, GUIDANCE AND STABILITY FOR ITS MEMBERS.
