

MOOSEHORN PEACE LUTHERAN CHURCH

THE PEACE LUTHERAN CHURCH WAS ORGANIZED BY A GROUP OF SETTLERS FROM RUSSIA ON APRIL 23, 1916. THE FIRST CHURCH WHICH WAS LOCATED ON A DONATED ACRE OF LAND SOUTH OF MOOSEHORN WAS BUILT AND MAINTAINED THROUGH MANY PERSONAL SACRIFICES OF THE SMALL CONGREGATION OF 21. IN 1947, THE CHURCH WAS REPLACED WITH A NEW ONE WHICH WAS LOCATED IN THE TOWN OF MOOSEHORN. THE ORIGINAL CHURCH WAS PRESENTED TO THE MARTIN LUTHER CONGREGATION IN HILBRE, MAN. A PARSONAGE WAS BUILT IN 1954 TO COMPLEMENT THE GROWING CONGREGATION AND AN EDUCATIONAL UNIT ADDED IN 1966. NINETEEN SIXTY NINE BOASTED A COUNT OF 196 CONFIRMED MEMBERS. THE EDUCATIONAL UNIT WAS SOLD IN 1977 DUE TO A DECLINING POPULATION. THE CHURCH WAS PLEASED AND BLESSED TO CELEBRATE IT'S 75TH ANNIVERSARY IN 1991 AND CONTINUES TO SERVE THE COMMUNITY TO THIS DAY. THE PEACE LUTHERAN CHURCH WITH IT'S "OLD WORLD" DESIGN SERVES AS A LANDMARK FOR MOOSEHORN AND WILL PROVIDE THE COMMUNITY WITH LEADERSHIP AND GUIDANCE AS IT ALWAYS HAS.
